





(60) were taken to separate the large from the small coal; the colliers, who were not skilled workmen, had no inducement to make as much large as possible, being paid at the same rate per chaldron for small as for large; and it was so much tossed about and trampled upon in its way from the pits, subject to not less than four lifts before it was stowed in the ship's hold, that it was little better than mere slack. Under these circumstances it is not surprising that Sydney coal did not sell readily in the United States. The lessees of the mines, it must be admitted, were less to blame for this state of things than the Government, which persisted in granting only short leases at exorbitant rates of royalty.
