The fellow he said was the greatest fid? dler he ever heard in his life--Big Ronald MacLellan. He used to listen to him a lot. He'd go over to that area, the Glendale area, and stay in one place for a certain period of time, you know. He'd come to visit his aunt down in Judique--Katie. She told me that he'd stay for awhile, and then he'd have to move on. When he was getting ardund like that, he was hearing a lot of fiddlers. Like Big Ronald. They no doubt had a great influence on him. Big Ronald was a fine composer, too, you know. He certainly was. I guess probably, it's just the way he got into it. Then he used to come back--when he'd come to Judigue--he used to visit at the Mac- Donnell home. Alexander was a fine fid? dler. And some of the other fiddlers at the time used to gather there. Peter Mac- Phee, and Archie Neil Chisholm, who was teaching at that time--back in .the '30s, I suppose--in the area. But the first time he went there, Alexander told him, "There's a MacDonald, a young fellow, comes here to visit. And he composes his own tunes, and I think he's going to be good!" So, I guess his prophecy was okay! (And this was his school, clearly, this home-to-home learning....) Oh, for sure. He worked in the woods, you know, around the Glendale area and Melford--he'd be over at Gordon MacQuarrie's. He was over there at Melford at Gordon MacQuarrie's when Gordon composed "The Bonny Lass of Head Lake." So he was in with all those fine players at the time. And Bill Lamey. Bill Lamey ran a radio program from Sydney--CJCB--back in the late '30s, I guess it was. And he brought Dan R. on as a guest one night, to play on a program. And he was the first person to put Dan R. on radio. Bill Lamey was. Of course, he was an excellent fiddler, too. So Dan R. was in with these people. And you know, I suppose--he enjoyed having a drink, too, of course. And he was a friendly fellow, you know. And he liked to be with people. And that's the way he was all his life, you know....
