They had lots of stuff, you know, raised lots of stuff on their farms. They fed themselves pretty much. And they'd get sale for certain goods. They weren't poor, actually. But they didn't have any ready money. They'd have to have those \$6 for the priest. We were never poor. Well, we weren't poor and we weren't rich.... They just strug? gled along like all the rest of them. Very little cash. But then, my father had a branch post office. That helped a little, you know. (When you first went to work for a priest, did you ask for a certain amount of mon? ey?) Oh, no. He told me what he could give me. And that was it. Thirty-five dollars a month. Everybody said, "Oh, the poor fellow. Look where he's going!" So I went along with him. He didn't even ask me. He said, "We are going." Well, I came too. (And were you still getting \$35 a month.) Yeah. (A good job, for the De? pression.) Well, yes--I was lucky to get a job. I was happy there, you know. I was my own boss, actually, you know. He'd never guestion.... Although I wasn't the best cook in the world for this man to be sat? isfied. There were some burnt offerings, I suppose, at times!... The reason mostly why I thought I'd like the work: I had a younger brother--he died when he was guite young. And he was kind of thinking that he might be a priest, too. Well, he just kind of talked it; I don't think he meant it.
