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past 11 by the time we got things cleared away. (Was that good money back then?) Edie chuckles. No.... Two years later, Johnny Reid organized the clerks' union. And we went down to the Miners' Forum, and he got up and talked. And he got a ruling that said a clerk could be paid no less than \$10. Going on green, you got \$10 a week. If you had the least bit experience, you started at \$11. And that's what start? ed it. Now, I was getting 10 or 11 when I left Samuels, although he hired me at 7. But when I went up to the Post, when I got the Post job, they put me on space--7C an inch. You had to take a ruler and mark off everything you had in the paper every day, and then turn it in at the end of the week. Well, sometimes I only made 8 or 10 dol? lars. Sometimes I could make it up to 28 or 29 dollars. And they thought that was too much, so they put me on salary for \$15! (So where did you find your story ideas back then?) Well, because I knew so many people. You know, this Evelyn Turner from Water Street was the one that was working with the government.
