(You could just borrow them?) Yeah, you'd borrow them and bring them back. We did. And at school the teacher would go around with an armful of books on Friday, and you could take home what you wanted. I always had three! We had lots of books. Everybody had books. The best Christmases were when you got books. They were good days. I can't remember ever feeling badly because we didn't--you know, like, even Grade 11, they used to have trips--they went in to the steel plant--they had a tour of the steel plant--and I couldn't go that day. But nobody ever thought of going any far? ther than (that)--Sydney was a big trip. In the church we would have debates, too, in the different church groups.
