He saved these letters and when he died they were among his papers, so Lennie saved them. He also had a house in Sydney, so perhaps lived there when family were gone. This then is the family background of Ve? nie Armstrong who married Harry Carmichael of Georges River in 1909 and came to live on the Carmichael farm in Georges River, where she lived until her death in 1958, age 76. The Armstrongs and Howies were honest, hardworking, law-abiding, relig? ious, neighborly, but due to the economic situation of the times, never acquired very much of this world's goods.
